


Pepper

She lost a major amount of blood, she needed to be released right away so that she could be transfused. She was beyond lethargic, uninterested in food, and the staff were scared that she was going to "die during the car ride." Well, she didn't die, and she underwent a blood transfusion. The very next morning, after receiving just the first unit of blood from Hemopet, Pepper was feeling much better and actually eating for the first time in a handful of days. If the doctors didn't have the blood, they could not have helped save her. That is priceless, something my family and I are extremely forever grateful for.


